# WINTER REMINDERS

## WINTER PARKING STARTS NOVEMBER 1

Oakdale's winter parking begins November 1 and ends April 1. During this time, vehicles may not park on city streets between the hours of 12 to 5 AM - or anytime snow accumulation equals or exceeds 2" until the street is cleared of snow.

### Frozen Pipes

Prolonged low temperatures and the increased depth of frost in the ground increases the likelihood of water pipes freezing. By monitoring your water service, you may be able to determine if the water service to your home or business is beginning to experience difficulties. One sign is seeing discolored water when you turn on the faucet. Another is a water temperature below 40 degrees. (TIP: to determine the water temperature, hold an instant read or kitchen thermometer under running water or immediately insert the thermometer into a water filled glass).

### Hydrants

Please consider adopting a fire hydrant to keep a path shoveled to the hydrant to be easily and quickly accessed by the fire department in the event of an emergency at your home or in your neighborhood.

### Mailboxes

To ensure mail delivery, please keep snow cleared away from the front of mailboxes. Properly installed mailboxes accidentally toppled by the blade of a snow plow will be replaced by Public Works as soon as time allows. If preferred, a new mailbox can be provided to the property owner to install.

### Plowing

The city is divided into defined plowing routes; within each route, priorities have been established that take into consideration topography, traffic volumes, and usage. For instance, more heavily traveled roads and roads adjacent to schools are given priority. Plows first clear the center of the roadway; subsequent passes by the plow move the snow onto the boulevard/easement. In cul-de-sacs, snow is piled either into the middle or at a predetermined spot

within the cul-de-sac. Snow stored in cul-de-sacs is removed as time allows. The city uses salt and other de-icers when there is hazardous ice or other slippery conditions; however, due to environmental concerns, use of these products is limited.

### Safety

Children are attracted to mounds of snow but please keep them from the areas along streets or the middle of cul-de-sacs where vehicles frequent and visibility could be impaired.

Due to the size and force of the snowplow, it is important to keep items, such as vehicles, rubbish containers, etc., at least five feet back from the edge of the street.

Shoveling, blowing, pushing, sweeping, or plowing snow or ice into a city street - whether or not the street has already been plowed - can result in a fine for the home owner.

### Sod Damage

If a snow plow causes sod damage, in the spring, you can decide whether to have the city provide you with sod that you place in the damaged area or the city will repair the area with topsoil and seed.

### Trash & Recycling Containers

On trash collection day, set your rubbish and recycling containers out prior to 7 AM. Place the containers on the driveway apron, behind the curb, out of the path of traffic and snow plows.

## BUCKTHORN CURBSIDE COLLECTION

### BUCKTHORN PILE SPECIFICATIONS



#### City-wide Buckthorn Curbside Pickup Guidelines

- The pickup will be restricted to buckthorn only.
- Piles should be no larger than 3.5' high, 3.5' wide, and up to 20' in length
- Please stack piles with the cut ends aligned and to the curb.
- Piles must be accessible by a log loader truck and must be off of paved driveways.
- City Forester has the right to inspect and reject piles that don't comply with the guidelines.
- Waivers must be filled out and received by the Friday before the scheduled collection date for pickup.

### CURBSIDE BUCKTHORN COLLECTION WAIVER

I have read the guidelines for the Oakdale Curbside Buckthorn Collection Program which are a requirement to receive a free collection service from the City. I have followed the guidelines provided for the curbside collection to insure the buckthorn is accessible by a log loader truck and I understand that the city is not responsible for repairing damages done to turf in the process of loading the piles.

Waivers must be filled out and received by the Friday before the scheduled collection date for pickup. Waivers can be mailed to or dropped off at Oakdale Public Works, 1900 Hadley Avenue North. Piles will be inspected the Monday before the scheduled collection to ensure that piles meet the requirements. Any piles that do not meet requirements will be rejected.

# CONSIDER ADOPTING A DRAIN!

Oakdale's bodies of water help keep our community healthy and vibrant by retaining moisture during droughts, recharging groundwater supplies, trapping floodwaters, and providing a habitat for fish and wildlife.

Protecting your local waterway from trash and organic pollutants is as simple as adopting a storm drain! Over 45 drains have already been adopted throughout Oakdale, including three in Walton Park by the city's own Environmental Management Commission.

To participate in the Adopt-a-Drain program:

1. Sign up. Visit [www.adopt-a-drain.org](http://www.adopt-a-drain.org) to find, claim, and name your drain.
2. Keep your drain clear. Sweep leaves, trash, and other debris off your drain's surface twice a month.
3. Track your impact. Keep an estimated total of the debris you collect from your drain and enter it into your online account.
4. Lead by example. Let friends and neighbors know about how you are helping the environment and encourage them to Adopt a Drain in their area.

Please consider helping to keep the lakes and wetlands in the community clean by keeping pollutants from entering storm drains.



## OAK TREES FACE ANOTHER ENEMY

### TWO-LINED CHESTNUT BORER

The Two-lined Chestnut Borer (TLCB) is a native beetle that attacks weakened oaks in Minnesota. It lives in and feeds on the inner bark and the layer between the bark and the wood. Oaks become susceptible to attack when stressed and usually die after two to three years of infestation.

### WAYS TO HELP YOUR OAK TREE

Keeping trees healthy and vigorous will allow them to fight off invading borers on their own. Do this through proper watering, if possible. During times of drought, water mature trees once a week preferably in the early morning or in the late evening to conserve water. Use a soaker hose to slowly drip water onto the ground under the entire canopy of the tree (from the trunk to the edge). Water long enough so water soaks six inches into the soil – this could take a few hours.



### OTHER PREVENTION MEASURES

Prevent borer attacks by keeping your oaks as free from stress as possible. Avoid adding soil over roots, do not fertilize stressed oaks, and do not allow herbicides to contact oak leaves. Mulch trees properly. If an oak tree in your yard is infested (e.g., the top half of its crown died in one growing season), cut it down and dispose of it during the winter (but make sure you are not misdiagnosing oak wilt). Removing infested oaks may save your other oaks from being attacked. Finally, avoid bringing fresh oak firewood into your yard. Make sure the firewood has been seasoned for at least one year before bringing it to your property, or use MDA-certified firewood ([www.mda.state.mn.us/plants-insects/firewood-producers](http://www.mda.state.mn.us/plants-insects/firewood-producers)).

# PARK INFORMATION

## OUTDOOR SKATE PARK

Location: Richard Walton Park  
Hadley Ave & 15 St, north of the  
tennis courts next to the hockey rink  
Hours: Daily from 8 AM to dusk

Skateboarders and in-line skaters  
of all ages may use this facility at no  
cost.

Park includes a half pipe, roll-ins,

volcano, driveways and canyon.

### Skate Park Rules

- Bikes and scooters are not permitted in the skate park.
- Helmets, elbow and knee pads are strongly encouraged.
- Smoking, alcohol, profanity and loud music are prohibited.
- Respect others, share the space.
- Please help keep the park clean. Dispose of trash in the proper containers.

## WINTER WALKING AT THE NATURE PRESERVE

During the winter season, the asphalt/paved trails throughout Oakdale Nature Preserve are cleared after each snowfall event to allow for winter walking. Please note, any snow that accumulates on the boardwalk will not be cleared.

## OAKDALE BARK PARK

The City's off-leash dog park is a great place for your pup to run off some energy and meet some new friends. The park, located off 50th Street, between Helena Road and Heather Ridge Road, is open year round. It is fenced with a transition corridor and a separate area for small dogs. A pet waste dispenser and trash cans are available for your convenience. The park also offers paved parking, benches, and running water (summer only). The park opens one half hour before sunrise and closes one half hour after sundown.

No fee or permit needed to utilize the park.

## PARK RULES

- Dogs must be properly leashed, vaccinated, not be in heat, and not designated as a dangerous dog.
- Dogs must be leashed prior to entering and prior to leaving the off-leash area and in transition corridors.
- Dogs must stay within fenced area when off leash.
- Pet parents are liable for damage or injury inflicted by their dogs.
- Pet parents must be in verbal control of their dogs at all times and prevent aggressive behavior, biting, fighting, or excessive barking.
- Pet parents must be at least 16 years of age and not handling more than two dogs.
- Pet parents must clean up and dispose of pet waste.
- Pet parents must have a visible leash with them.

## KEEP PUPS LEASHED

With the exception of the Oakdale Bark Park, dogs must be leashed when visiting city parks and anytime they are out and about in the city.

## PICK UP AFTER PUPS

Please keep Oakdale free of dog droppings! When in a park, use a convenient Mutt Mitt's dispenser. When out walking, carry a few bags with you to keep our streets, trails, boulevards, and sidewalks free of droppings.

# PARK INFORMATION

## SKATING RINKS & WARMING HOUSES

Outdoor skating rinks are located throughout the City of Oakdale and offer general skating and hockey facilities. Weather permitting, rinks are scheduled to close in late February. The following guidelines will be used to determine outdoor rink closures:

- Warmer temperatures soften the ice and can create unsafe skating conditions. Estimated temperatures of 37 degrees or higher may cause rink closures.
- When actual temperature reaches -10 degrees or wind chill temperature reaches -25 degrees.
- If more than 3 inches of snow accumulate on the ice when maintenance crews are not available.

### OAKDALE POLICE CAPTAIN NICHOLAS NEWTON NAMED AS NEXT POLICE CHIEF



After a comprehensive recruitment process, City Administrator Christina M. Volkers recommended Nicholas Newton to the position of Oakdale Police Chief.

Oakdale Police Chief William Sullivan retired on July 31, 2021 after over

33 years in Oakdale. City leadership engaged a recruiting firm to recruit the next police chief for Oakdale.

The recruitment process was very comprehensive and included submission of materials, video interviews, telephone and in-person interviews, feedback sessions with current police department staff, reference/academic checking, background investigation, and other various processes. Thirty applicants were evaluated resulting in the selection of four finalists. Final interviews were conducted by several panels and many stakeholders and Newton emerged as the preferred candidate.

Newton is currently a Captain in the Oakdale Police Department and served as interim Police Chief since August 1, 2021.

Newton has been a member of

the Oakdale Police Department for 20 years, rising in rank from patrol officer to sergeant in 2006 to captain in 2020. Newton is a graduate of the FBI National Academy in Quantico, VA and the Northwestern University School of Police Staff and Command, in addition to holding both a Master's Degree in Criminal Justice Leadership and a Bachelor's Degree in Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice.
