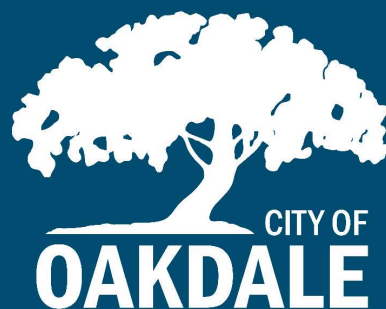

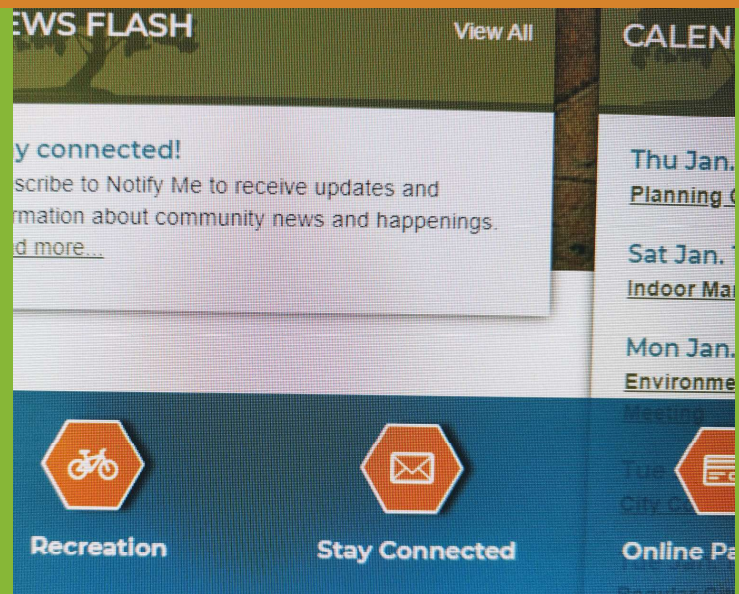

MEET YOUR STORM SEWER

(Did you know you can adopt me at Adopt-a-Drain.org?)

Hello. I'm the storm sewer in your neighborhood. My job is to carry water off your street to lakes, rivers, and wetlands. Unfortunately, the water often brings along with it things like leaves, grass, trash, pet waste, fertilizer, and other items that can negatively affect water quality which, in turn, can be harmful to the fish, birds, and wildlife that depend on clean water. But guess what? You have the power to make sure only water goes into the storm drain! Here's how:

- Keep leaves, seeds, and grass clippings out of streets and gutters.
- Keep trash out of streets and gutters.
- Keep pet waste out of streets and gutters.
- Choose zero-phosphorous fertilizers and keep any spilled fertilizer out of streets and gutters.

CITY SEEKING FEEDBACK FOR BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN PLAN



Last summer the City of Oakdale started the process of updating its bike and pedestrian plan. The updated plan will guide bike and pedestrian improvements, in accordance with goals outlined in the City's comprehensive plan, over the next 10 to 20 years. The updated plan is expected to be complete in fall 2020.

The City is currently accepting input from the community, which will help the project team make recommendations about how to make Oakdale more bikeable and walkable.

KEEP THINGS GREEN USING LESS WATER

- Water grass and gardens early in the day when temperatures tend to be lower.
- Set a timer when you turn on sprinklers to remind you to turn sprinklers off.
- Position sprinklers so you aren't also watering your driveway or the street.
- Use drip irrigation, soaker hoses and bubblers.
- Use a Smart Controller on your irrigation system.
- Fix leaking faucets and hoses.
- Collect rain water and use to water plants.
- Replace sodded areas with flowers, food producing plants, and native plants.
- Collect water from dehumidifiers and household tasks such as cooking and use to water plants.
- Use a broom instead of a hose to clean up paved areas.
- Mulch around plants to help hold in moisture.

CITY TO CONDUCT COMMUNITY SURVEY

This year the City of Oakdale is conducting a community survey. Households will be selected at random to participate. Through the survey, residents rate City services and the quality of life in Oakdale. They also give their opinions about some specific issues and potential projects.

The survey is conducted in partnership with National Research Center (NRC), a Colorado survey research firm. The results provide valuable feedback to the City Council about Oakdale's ongoing services. PRIMARY ELECTION: August 11

Need to Register to Vote?

Preregister by July 21 at www.mnvotes.org or register at your polling place on Election Day.

Want to Vote Early or by Mail?

Early/Absentee voting for the August 11 Primary Election begins June 26 and ends August 10.

Filing for Candidacy: July 28 to August 11

GENERAL ELECTION: November 3

Need to Register to Vote?

Preregister by October 13 at www.mnvotes.org or register at your polling place on Election Day.

Want to Vote Early or by Mail?

Early/Absentee Voting for the November 3 General Election begins September 18 and ends November 2.

ELECTION 2020: FAQ

Q. Do I need to register to vote at each election?

A. You only need to register if (1) this is your first time ever voting, (2) if your name or address has changed from the last time you voted, or (3) if you haven't voted in the past four years. Visit www.mnvotes.org to confirm that you are registered at your current address or to register ahead of time. You can also register at your polling place on election day by providing the required proofs of residency.

Q. Oakdale has eight polling locations; how do I know which one is assigned to me?

A. Visit pollfinder.sos.state.mn.us; put in your zip code, house number, and street name to learn your polling place.

Q. Can I vote early at Oakdale City Hall?

A. Absolutely! City Hall, located at 1584 Hadley Avenue, will again serve as an early voting location for Washington County residents. Vote in person during these times:

PRIMARY ELECTION (August 11)

June 26 to August 7: 8 AM to 4:30 PM

August 8: 8 AM to 3 PM

August 10: 8 AM to 5 PM

GENERAL ELECTION (November 3)

September 18 to October 30: 8 AM to 4:30 PM

October 31: 8 AM to 3 PM

November 2: 8 AM to 5 PM

Q. Can I vote early by mail?

A. Absolutely! Apply for absentee ballots at www.mnvotes.org or by calling Washington County at 651-430-6175.

Q. I would like to run for Oakdale city council. When do I need to file for office?

A. Residents may file for the two city council seats at Oakdale City Hall, 1584 Hadley Avenue, from July 28 to August 11. The filing fee is \$5. Candidates will be on the November 3 General Election ballot; persons elected will take office in January of 2021 and serve four year terms.

The Oakdale Discovery Center is located at 4444 Hadley Avenue (find hours on Page 1). The facility is nestled within the wooded and scenic 220-acre Oakdale Nature Preserve and offers rotating art exhibits, aquarium, wildlife exhibits, book and movie exchange, facility rental, and a fireplace with cozy seating. Nearby, discover miles of trails, a forest garden, a floating boardwalk over Mud Lake, fitness stations, and a historic one-room schoolhouse.

DISCOVER ALL THE DISCOVERY CENTER HAS TO OFFER!

BINOCULARS

Stop by the Discovery Center during regular hours to borrow a pair of binoculars to use for exploring in the Oakdale Nature Preserve. Please plan to present a photo ID.

DISCOVERY BACKPACKS

Stop at the Discovery Center during regular hours to borrow one of our "Discovery Backpacks." Inside the packs you will find everything needed for an exploration into the adjacent Oakdale Nature Preserve. Seek out animal tracks, identify different trees and flowers, go on a scavenger hunt, use binoculars to bird watch or catch a glimpse of the deer, fox and owls that call the Nature Preserve home. Catch interesting critters using the insect net.

NORDIC WALKING POLES

Stop by the Discovery Center during regular hours to borrow our Nordic Walking Poles (adult size only). Using Nordic Walking poles turns your walk into a total body exercise that delivers far more motivating results and makes walking more fun! Poles resembling ski poles are used to involve the upper extremities, toning and firming every major muscle at the same time. The poles have rubber tips making it possible to use them on pavement while reducing the impact of the hard surface. Please plan to present a photo ID.

SWAP BOOKS AND MOVIES

Bring gently used books and movies to the Discovery Center and swap them for something "new." Books must be in good, readable condition, with the cover intact. Movies must be fully operable and in their original case. The swap is an even exchange. Books exchanged for books, etc. No VHS tapes can be accepted.

SCAVENGER HUNT CHALLENGE

Pick up a Scavenger Hunt Guide at the Discovery Center and then head out into the wild (aka Oakdale Nature Preserve) for a fun and educational scavenger hunt! Prizes given to those who find the items listed in the guide! *(Prizes are age 12 and under appropriate).*

TANDEM BIKES

Stop by the Discovery Center during regular hours to borrow a tandem bike. There are two available including one that accommodates youth sizes *(At least one of the riders needs to be over the age of 18)*. Please plan to present a photo ID.

Have you discovered the restored one-room school house at the Oakdale Nature Preserve? It was built in 1888 as District #12 of Washington County and known as the Eder School. It closed in 1920 and became a storage shed until it was moved to the Oakdale Nature Preserve and restored by the Oakdale-Lake Elmo Historical Society in 2004. Today it is operated by the Washington County Historical Society.

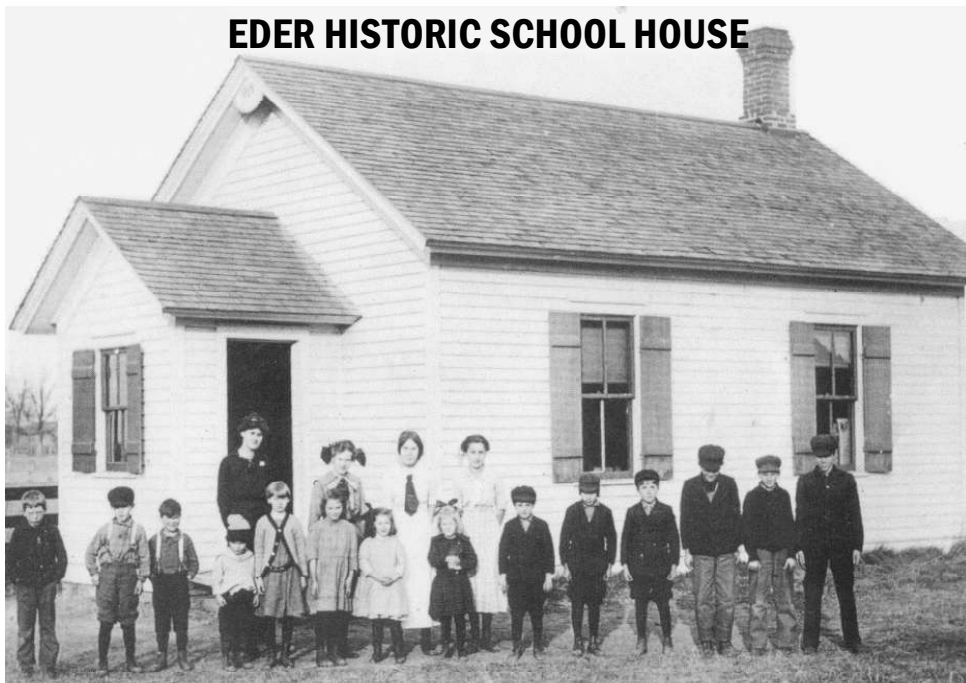

APPLE RIVER GUIDED KAYAK TOUR

Minimum Age: 15 with a parent

Join other outdoor enthusiasts for a guided paddle of the scenic Wisconsin Apple River. Enjoy a relaxing three-hour downstream kayak trip covering eight miles of a remote stretch of the river.

Meet up at the River Island Park in Star Prairie, Wisconsin. We will shuttle to the starting point where you will receive a paddling and safety overview before we get on the water. Then we will begin our journey to see wildflowers, eagles, and other river life.

Bring a lunch to enjoy along the way. Recommended for people with some kayaking/canoeing experience. Must be able to maneuver around downed trees, branches, and some small ripples for the last half mile.

Time: Meet at 9 AM at River Island Park, Star Prairie, WI

Cost: \$65/per person. Includes single kayak, paddle, life vest, shuttle to starting point, and support throughout the day.

Bring Along: Bottled water, snacks, bag lunch, hat, sunscreen, sunglasses, binoculars, and a dry bag/large Ziploc for your gear.

Wear: Dress in layers; wear shoes that strap on and can get wet.

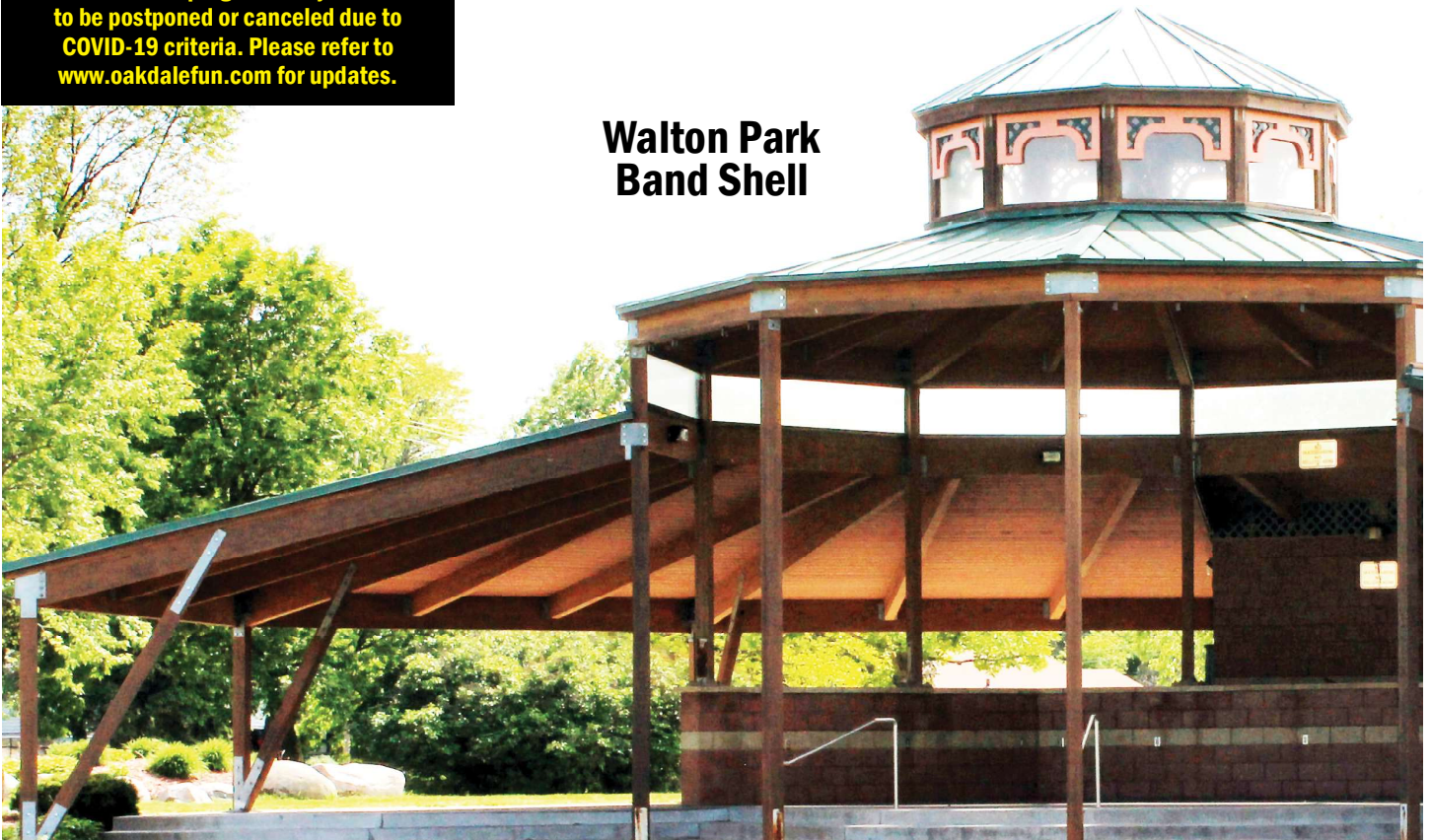

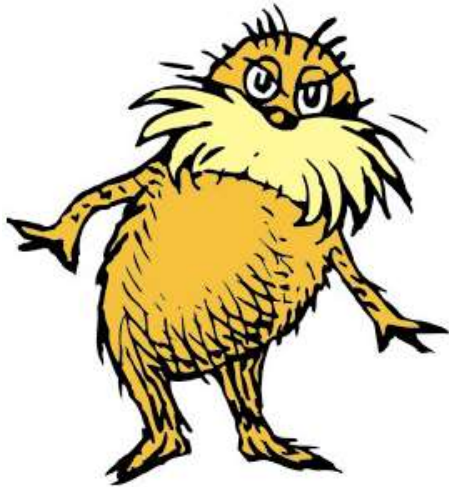

OAKDALE BARK PARK

The City's off-leash dog park is a great place for your pup to run off some energy and meet some new friends. The park, located off 50th Street, between Helena Road and Heather Ridge Road, is open year round. It is fenced with a transition corridor and a separate area for small dogs. A pet waste dispenser and trash cans are available for your convenience. The park also offers paved parking, benches, and running water (summer only). The park opens one half hour before sunrise and closes one half hour after sundown.

Park Rules

- Dogs must be properly leashed, vaccinated, not be in heat, and not designated as a dangerous dog.
- Dogs must be leashed prior to entering and prior to leaving the off-leash area and in the transition corridors.
- Dogs must stay within fenced area when off leash.
- Pet parents are liable for damage or injury inflicted by their dogs.
- Pet parents must be in verbal control of their dogs at all times and prevent aggressive behavior, biting, fighting, or excessive barking.
- Pet parents must be at least 16 years of age and not handling more than two dogs.
- Pet parents must clean up and dispose of pet waste.
- Pet parents must have a visible leash with them at all times.

KEEP PUPS LEASHED

With the exception of the Oakdale Bark Park, dogs must be leashed when visiting city parks and anytime they are out and about in the city..

PICK UP AFTER PUPS

Please keep Oakdale free of dog droppings! When in a park, use a convenient Mutt Mitt's dispenser.

When out walking, carry a few bags with you to keep our streets, trails, boulevards, and sidewalks free of droppings.

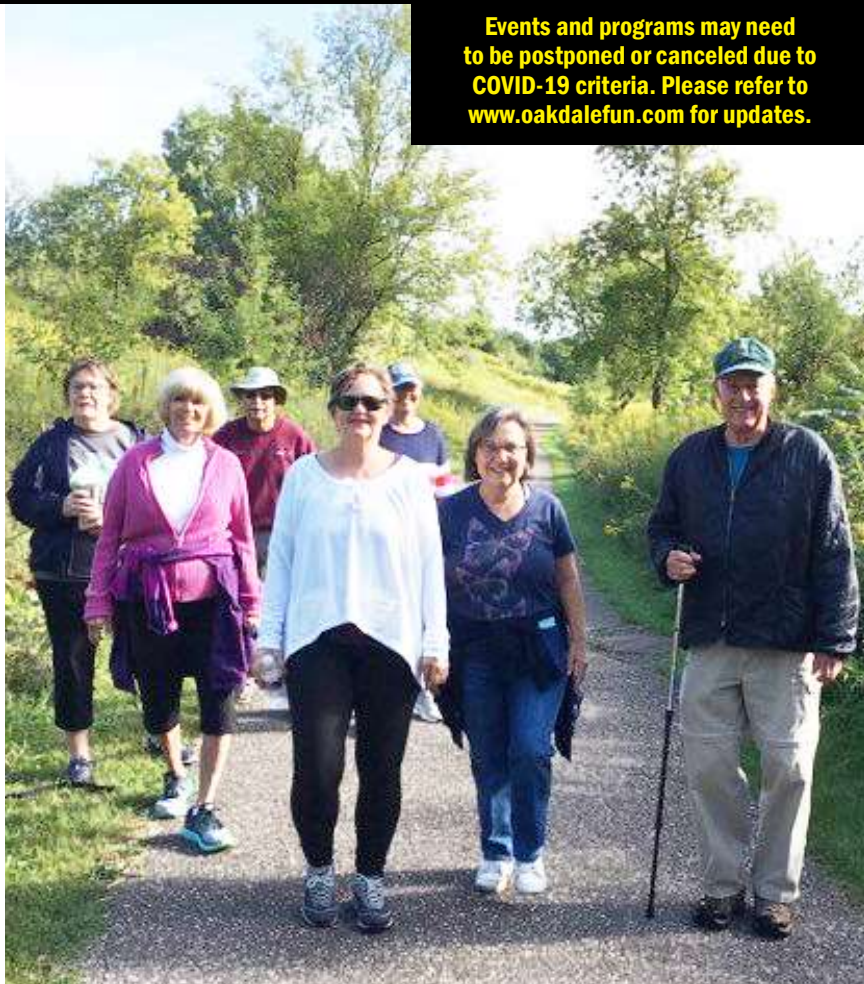
