OAKDALE RECEIVES UPGRADED CREDIT RATING

Moody's Investor Service elevates the City of Oakdale from Aa2 to Aa1 rating

In June, Moody's Investor Service upgraded the City of Oakdale's general obligation unlimited tax (GOULT) and credit rating from Aa2 to Aa1. According to Moody's, the upgrade reflects the City's very strong financial position, growing tax base with above-average resident wealth and income, and moderate debt burden.

The City of Oakdale was able to secure its first upgrade since 2010, when it went from Aa3 to Aa2, despite a turbulent financial environment due to the COVID-19 pandemic. This historic upgrade should find the City better positioned to leverage future debt obligations, reduce borrowing costs and interest rates, and provide greater benefits to Oakdale residents, business owners and visitors.

Oakdale is among the upper echelon of Minnesota cities that enjoy and benefit from this outstanding credit rating. The Aa1 credit rating is the second-highest available from Moody's, a leading global provider of credit ratings, research and risk analysis.

"Being elevated to an Aa1 credit rating has been a goal of ours for many years," said Oakdale City Administrator Christina Volkers. "We have worked diligently to strengthen the

financial condition of the City of Oakdale, and we reached this milestone in June."

"This success should be credited to our extremely hard-working City finance staff, along with the unwavering support of our elected leaders – the Mayor and City Council," Volkers said. "We are so proud to share our success and the benefits of this rating upgrade with the residents of Oakdale."

Moody's provides international fiscal research on bonds issued by commercial and government agencies. A borrower's creditworthiness is measured by Moody's standardized rating scale which assesses expected investor loss in the event of default. Securities are assigned a rating from Aaa to C, with Aaa being the highest quality and C the lowest quality.

LOCAL OPTION SALES TAX SET FOR VOTE

On August 8, the Oakdale City Council voted unanimously to put a local option sales tax on the November 8, 2022 ballot to fund a new Public Works facility and to expand and remodel the Police facility. The proposed projects will help Oakdale better serve its growing community by providing facilities that meet today's standards and staffing needs.

Since Oakdale became a city in 1974, its population has nearly tripled to over 28,000 residents and is expected to increase to over 35,000 upon completion of planned projects. City services have continued to evolve but facilities have not. Changes to staffing models, space constraints and inefficiencies created by the building layouts of both the Public Works and Police facilities present major operational challenges.

After exploring several options to address these issues, the City Council determined a local option sales tax would be the fairest way to fund the proposed capital projects. With a sales tax, the burden is shared equally by residents and non-residents who also benefit from the services of Oakdale's Police and Public Works departments.

Oakdale residents will be presented with two ballot questions asking if the City should fund the facilities with a one-half of one percent increase. The current tax rate is 7.375 percent, and the new tax rate, if approved, would increase to 7.875 percent and would go into effect in 2023.

LOCAL OPTION SALES TAX FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is a local option sales tax?

A local option sales tax (L.O.S.T.) is simply a sales tax that is collected within the geographic boundaries of a city or county. Local option sales taxes apply to the same items and services as the general state sales tax.

What can L.O.S.T. funds collected be used for?

Local governments in Minnesota use the local option sales tax to fund capital projects such as public buildings, libraries, parks, and other amenities.

Can any city create a L.O.S.T.?

Yes and no. Cities can explore creating and collecting a L.O.S.T. but the process to do so is defined by state law. Before a L.O.S.T. can be collected, it must receive approval from the state legislature, the local governing body (i.e. the City Council or County Board of Commissioners), **AND** the voters via a ballot referendum.

What does Oakdale want to fund using a sales tax?

Oakdale's City Council has identified two large-scale building projects and identified the local option sales tax as the preferred funding source. Oakdale's Police and Public Works facilities – built in 1992 and 1985, respectively – were constructed when Oakdale had a

smaller population and the need for services was vastly different. These facilities need to be updated and/or replaced to meet the needs of a growing community.

Were other funding sources considered?

Yes, the City Council considered several options, including property taxes, and concluded the L.O.S.T. made the most sense for Oakdale residents. The benefit of the new Police Department and Public Works facilities and the services these departments provide would be felt by not only Oakdale residents but by anyone that works, shops, or visits Oakdale. In an independent study conducted by the University of Minnesota Extension office, analyzing general state sales tax collected in Oakdale, the data showed that **50 percent** of all sales tax collected comes from non-Oakdale residents.

How much would the L.O.S.T. be and how long would it be in effect?

The proposed L.O.S.T. would be one-half of one percent (0.5%), or \$.50 on every \$100 of taxable purchases. State law requires the tax to automatically sunset once funds required for the projects are collected, or 25 years, whichever occurs first.

The total sales tax, if approved by voters – to finance one or both projects – will not exceed one-half of one percent (0.5%).

WHAT WILL THIS LOOK LIKE ON THE BALLOT?

Question 1: Considering Sales Tax for Construction of New Public Works Facility

Shall the City of Oakdale be authorized to impose a temporary sales and use tax to finance all or a portion of the cost of constructing a new Public Works Facility, in an amount equal to one-half of one percent (0.5%) for a period of twenty-five (25) years or until \$22,000,000 plus the costs of collecting and administering the tax and the costs of issuing any bonds including interest is collected, provided that such tax shall terminate sooner if the City Council determines that all such costs have been paid?

The total sales and use tax approved by voters at this election to finance this project and any other project will not exceed one-half of one percent (0.5%).

Question 2: Considering Sales Tax for Expansion and Remodel of Police Facility

Shall the City of Oakdale be authorized to impose a temporary sales and use tax to finance all or a portion of the cost of construction and rehabilitation and associated building costs of the Oakdale Police Department Facility, in an amount equal to one-half of one percent (0.5%) for a period of twenty-five (25) years or until \$15,000,000 plus the costs of collecting and administering the tax and the costs of issuing any bonds including interest is collected, provided that such tax shall terminate sooner if the City Council determines that all such costs have been paid?

The total sales and use tax approved by voters at this election to finance this project and any other project will not exceed one-half of one percent (0.5%).



SEASONAL REMINDERS



MAILBOXES

To ensure mail delivery, clear snow away from mailbox fronts. Properly installed mailboxes accidentally toppled by the blade of a snow plow will be replaced by City crews as soon as time allows. A new mailbox can also be provided for property owners to install if preferred. Residents should check and repair mailboxes prior to winter to ensure they are in good condition.

WINTER PARKING RESTRICTIONS

Winter parking restrictions run November 1 through April 1. During this time, no vehicles may park on City streets between the hours of 12 to 5 AM, or anytime snow accumulation equals or exceeds two inches until the street is cleared of snow.

FROZEN PIPES

Prolonged low temperatures and increased depth of frost in the ground increases the likelihood of water pipes freezing. Frozen pipes are at risk of expanding, rupturing and causing interruption of water service.

By monitoring water service, residents and businesses can determine if the service is experiencing difficulties. One sign is discolored water when a faucet is turned on. Another sign is water temperature below 40 degrees.

To lessen the chance of frozen pipes, run a faucet at a slow trickle to keep water flowing through the pipes.

PLOWING AND SNOW REMOVAL

Oakdale is divided into defined plowing routes with priorities based on topography, traffic volumes and usage. The City uses de-icers and salt on a limited basis for hazardous ice and slippery conditions. To ensure an efficient and timely snow removal process, residents can help:

- Follow Oakdale winter parking restrictions.
- Be patient! Plowing the entire City takes time.
- Be prepared for winter driving delays.
- Keep children away from curbs and boulevards when plows are out.
- Keep fire hydrants clear of snow.
- Don't push, shovel, blow, sweep or plow snow onto a City street at any time.
- When sharing the road with snowplows, give them room to work and don't pass a snowplow.
- Place your garbage and recycling containers behind the curb on collection day prior to 7 AM. Keep containers out of the path of traffic and snow plows.

TURKEY FRYER SAFETY

Make sure there is two feet of space between the tank and burner. Never use a propane fryer near a structure that can catch fire. Cover skin when adding or removing food from the fryer. Completely thaw and dry the turkey before placing in the fryer. Check oil temps frequently. Do not extinguish fires with water.

OAKDALE CELEBRATES NATIONAL NIGHT OUT

Prior to the event, neighborhoods could register with the City to host a National Night Out block party. This year, there were 19 registered parties that welcomed Oakdale Police and Fire department representatives. These gatherings allowed positive interactions between residents of all ages with public safety officials and included cookouts, educational discussions and photo opportunities with officers and Police and Fire vehicles.

POLICE DEPARTMENT PREPARES TO IMPLEMENT BODY WORN CAMERA SYSTEM

Law enforcement use of body worn cameras (BWCs) has become an expectation for many Minnesota residents. The City of Oakdale has been preparing to join many neighboring cities by implementing this technology. Earlier this year, a committee of Oakdale officers tested several body worn camera systems and presented potential options to the City Council for review.

Per Minnesota statutes, the City will provide a public feedback period where residents can respond to a survey and attend an open house at City Hall on Thursday, October 13 from 5 to 7 PM. Additionally, the City must have a BWC policy in place to guide the use of the system. Once feedback has been reviewed from the comment period, the draft policy will be finalized. The City Council will then vote on approval of the policy and purchase of the equipment later this year. Implementation of the body worn camera system is planned for early 2023.

ENVIRONMENT

BUCKTHORN CURBSIDE COLLECTION DATES SET

Buckthorn is an invasive, non-native plant species that threatens natural resources and spreads very quickly. The City of Oakdale encourages residents to help remove buckthorn from their property. This year's dates for free curbside pickup of buckthorn have been set for the following Tuesdays:

- September 20
- October 4
- October 18



Guidelines for curbside pickup are:

- Pickup is restricted to only buckthorn.
- Piles should be no larger than 3.5 feet high, 3.5 feet wide and up to 20 feet in length.
- Piles need to be stacked with cut ends aligned and to the curb.
- Piles must be accessible by a log loader truck and must be off paved driveways.
- The City Forester has the right to inspect and reject piles that don't comply with guidelines.



ONLINE WAIVER FORM

To receive curbside pickup services, residents must complete a waiver by the Friday before the scheduled collection date. Piles will be inspected the Monday before the scheduled collection to ensure piles meet the requirements. Any piles that do not meet the requirements will be rejected.

Residents desiring curbside pickup can complete and submit a waiver form online using the QR code above. There is also a printable PDF waiver available on the Oakdale website that can be dropped off at Public Works or mailed to: City Forester, 1900 Hadley Avenue North

CONSTRUCTION BEGINS ON IMPACT APARTMENTS

Norhart began construction on the 328-unit Impact apartment building in September. The complex, located conveniently near the future METRO Gold Line Helmo station, will also include luxury amenities such as a rooftop pool as well as 6,500 square feet of retail space. Pre-leasing begins in early 2023.

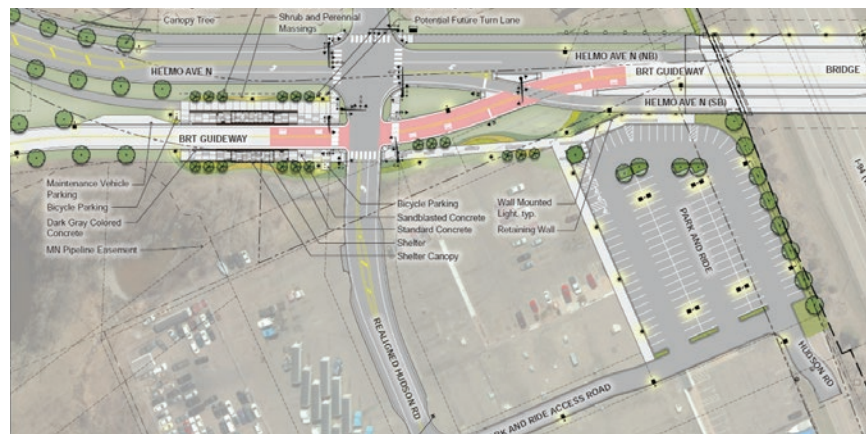
METRO GOLD LINE CONSTRUCTION BEGINS THIS FALL

Construction on the METRO Gold Line Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) is set to begin this fall with service expected in 2025. Planning for this 10-mile transit route with bus-only lanes will connect the East metro with jobs, housing and other regional transit along the Interstate 94 corridor. The Helmo station in Oakdale already has approved plans for business and housing development that will continue to help the city grow. The Greenway station serving Oakdale and Landfall also has significant potential for future development opportunities.

In April, the Federal Transit Administration approved project plans to begin the engineering work. Utility updates along the planned route followed. Planned future METRO Gold Line BRT construction – some beginning in September – includes:

- Construction of bus-only lanes.
- Repavement of existing lanes.
- Building of bus stations and Park & Ride facilities.
- Bridge and underpass construction.
- Upgrading of traffic signals and intersections.
- Adding trails, utilities, lighting and landscaping.

- Dogs must be leashed prior to entering and prior to leaving the off-leash area and in transition corridors.
- Dogs must stay within fenced area when off leash.
- Pet parents are liable for damage or injury inflicted by their dogs.
- Pet parents must be in verbal control of their dogs at all times to prevent aggressive behavior, biting, fighting and excessive barking.
- Pet parents must be 16 years or older and not handling more than two dogs.
- Pet parents must clean up and dispose of waste.

MAY HAIL STORM CAUSES WIDESPREAD DAMAGE

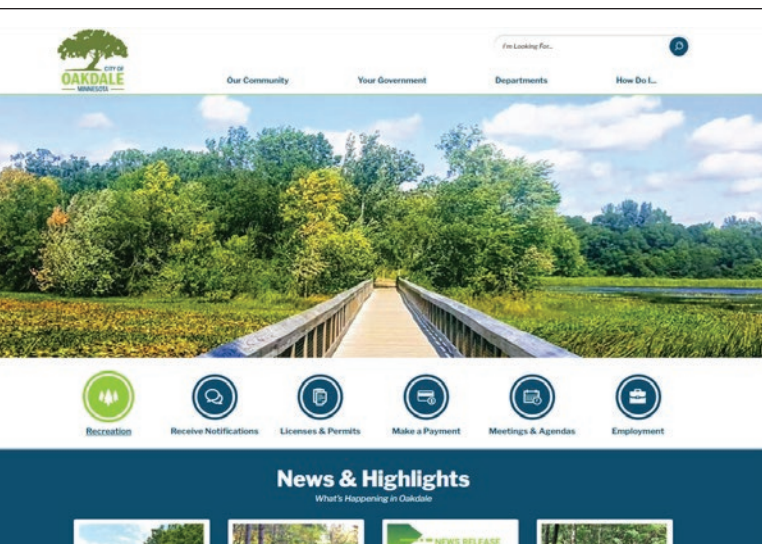

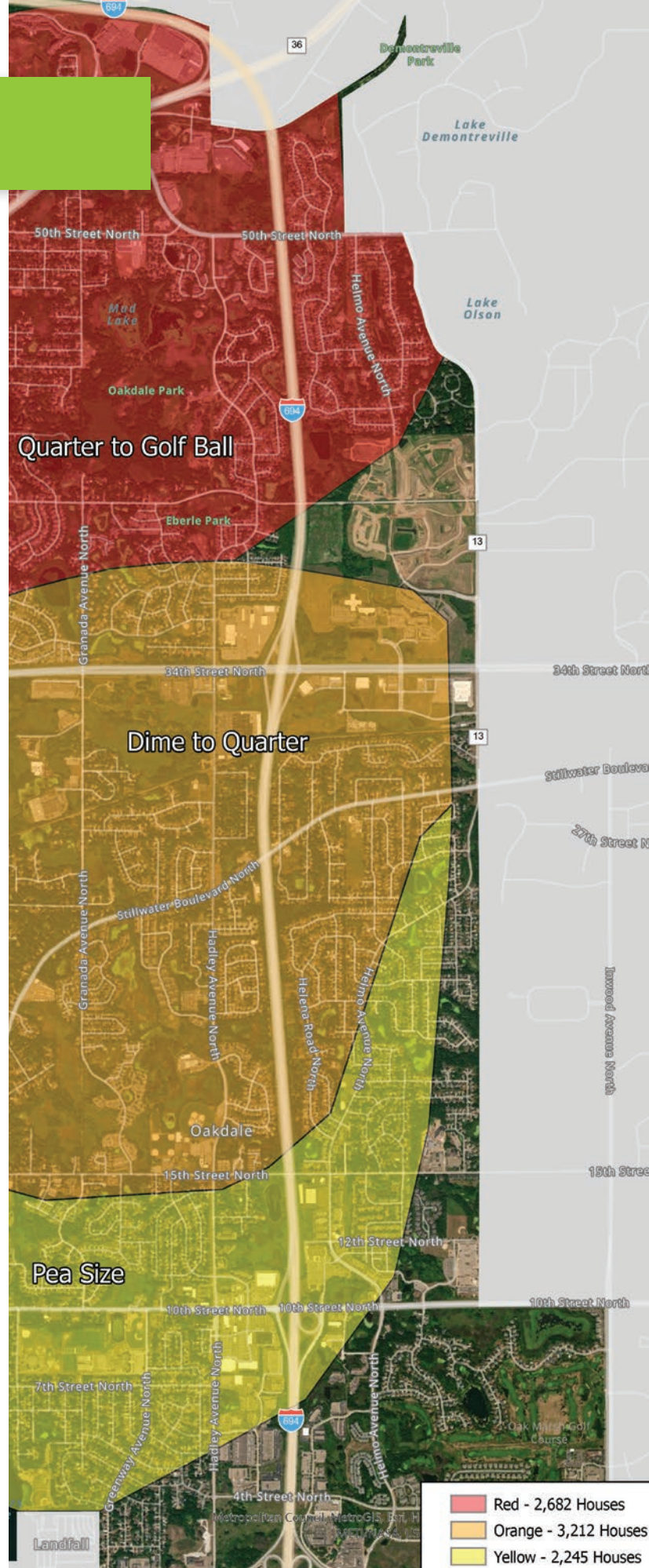
OAKDALE WEBSITE GETS NEW LOOK
