FOOD SCRAPS PICKUP PROGRAM LAUNCHES

Oakdale residents can now sign up for a free annual supply of bags to participate.

The Food Scraps Pickup Program is now available to all Oakdale residents. Ramsey and Washington Counties are working together to bring communities a new way to recycle food scraps from home. This program will allow participants to collect food scraps in free bags provided through the program and put them in trash carts or dumpsters for collection.

Food scraps such as fruit and vegetable peels, eggshells and coffee grounds make up 20 percent of trash.

Recycling food scraps helps turn them into soil rather than waste. The Food Scraps Pickup Program is an accessible way for Oakdale residents to participate in food recycling and help reduce waste.

How It Works



Order your free supply of food scrap bags.



Collect your food scraps in the bags. Once a week or when the bag is full, tie a knot at the top to close the bag.



Place your bag inside your trash cart or dumpster for collection.



Done! The food scraps will be composted.

CONSTRUCTION UPDATES

Summer 2024 includes several major construction projects impacting Oakdale.

Plan ahead when traveling in construction areas.

- **Hadley Avenue N:** As part of the City's annual Street Improvement Program, Hadley Avenue N and surrounding streets will be reconstructed between 40th Street N and 50th Street N. Trails in-and-around the Nature Preserve will also be reconstructed.
- **Highway 120/Geneva Avenue N:** Lane closures on either side of Interstate 94 on Highway 120/Geneva Avenue N will continue for construction of the Metro Transit Gold Line Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) bridge over the roadway. The ramp from Highway 120 to eastbound Interstate 94 is closed through October.
- **Hudson Boulevard N:** Hudson Boulevard N will have a two-phase closure to reconstruct the roadway for the Gold Line BRT. The current closure includes Highway 120 to Dellwood Lane and Greystone Avenue N to Hadley Avenue N. Business access is from 10th Street N to Greystone Avenue N. Additional closures of Hudson Boulevard and Hadley Avenue south of 4th Street N are expected later in the summer.
- **4th Street N:** The 4th Street N bridge over Interstate 694 has been removed and will be rebuilt to accommodate the Gold Line BRT. 4th Street N remains closed through the fall from Hadley Avenue N to Helmo Avenue N. Business and residential access will be maintained. Please follow posted detours.
- **Interstate 694:** There will be occasional lane and directional closures of Interstate 694 for work on the 4th Street N bridge. Additionally, the on-ramp to northbound Interstate 694 from 10th Street N is closed through October to accommodate detour traffic from Interstate 94.
- **Interstate 94:** The Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT) will work to complete its Interstate 94 project between Highway 120 and the St. Croix River. Eastbound Interstate 94 will be reduced to two lanes between Highway 120 and Woodbury Drive through mid-July. Additional closures of ramps and lanes will occur through late fall.

ELECTION INFORMATION

Here's some important information voters need to know this election season.

IMPORTANT ELECTION DATES

- June 28 to August 12 - Vote early by mail or in-person for Primary Election
- August 13 - Primary Election Day
- September 20 to November 4 - Vote early by mail or in-person for General Election
- November 5 - General Election Day

FILING INFORMATION FOR CITY COUNCIL

Two City Council Member seats will be on the November 5 ballot. Persons interested in running for office must apply in person at Oakdale City Hall (1584 Hadley Avenue N) during regular hours from July 30 to August 13 at 5 PM. The filing fee is \$5.

EARLY VOTING AT CITY HALL

City Hall will serve as a Washington County early voting location for 18 days prior to the Primary Election and General Election Days. Residents must vote at their precinct polling location on Election Day.

BRANCH/BRUSH DISPOSAL

Public Works accepts branches and brush under eight inches in diameter for a nominal fee. Drop off hours are Monday to Friday, 7:30 AM to 3 PM, through the third Friday in October. No grass clippings or bagged leaves are allowed for drop off at the Public Works building (1900 Hadley Avenue N).

OUTDOOR WARNING SIRENS

Outdoor warning sirens are tested at 1 PM on the first Wednesday of each month, March through October.

REPORT A CONCERN

Later this month, the City will begin using SeeClickFix, an app-based reporting tool for resident concerns and issues. See a pothole that needs fixing or a street light out? Report it with SeeClickFix. More information will be shared on www.oakdalemn.gov once residents can access the app.

ACORN AWARD NOMINATIONS

Each summer, the Oakdale Acorn Awards recognize outstanding properties in the City for excellence in landscaping. Residents may submit nominations for as many properties as desired by June 30. Winners will receive recognition from the City Council and an award. Nominations are accepted in the following categories: Business/Commercial; Public (churches, schools, government); and Residential. To nominate a property, please visit www.oakdalemn.gov/651/Acorn-Award.

WATERING SCHEDULE

Oakdale operates under a year-round odd-even watering schedule. Odd-numbered addresses are allowed to water on odd-numbered days. Even-numbered addresses are allowed to water on even-numbered days. Residents and businesses are encouraged to refrain from watering during 10 AM and 5 PM when water loss is greatest.

ILLICIT DISCHARGE

Only rain, melted snow and sump pump discharge should enter storm drains. Yard waste, automotive fluids, pet waste or other illicit discharge that enters a storm sewer can flow into lakes, rivers and ponds causing pollution. Report illegal dumping or illicit discharge if you see it. Do not dispose of grass clippings, animal excrement or other discharge into ponding areas, which can also affect water quality of wetlands and lakes.

TALL GRASS

Beginning June 1, grass must be kept at a maximum of six inches, cut at least every two weeks, and weeds kept under control. When the City receives a complaint, the property owner has five days to cut the grass, or the City will cut the grass and charge the property owner.

BUCKTHORN MANAGEMENT

A weed wrench is available through the City to assist residents with buckthorn removal. Buckthorn can also be dropped off for free at Public Works. Please call **651-730-2740** for wrench availability and details.

ANNUAL DRINKING WATER REPORT

Each year the City makes available its annual report on drinking water which includes information about source water, levels of contaminants and compliance with drinking water rules. 


