RESIDENT RESOURCE: Important Stuff to Know

BACKYARD (RECREATIONAL) FIRES are allowed when:

- The base of the fire does not exceed three feet in diameter
- Flames do not exceed two feet in height
- Fire is contained in a fire ring of noncombustible material
- Fire ring is located at least 25' from any structure
- Water source is in close proximity
- Fire is attended until extinguished
- Burning only clean, dry wood; not treated lumber, leaves, trash, furniture, etc.
- Fire does not produce smoke that causes discomfort or a negative impact to neighboring properties.

BEYOND THE YELLOW RIBBON. As a Yellow Ribbon City, Oakdale assists members of the military and their families with errands to home maintenance. To learn more, please call Marc Cove at 651-332-5222.

BRUSH DISPOSAL. From mid-April to October, for a nominal fee, you may take branches and brush, under 8" in diameter, to Oakdale Public Works, 1900 Hadley, Monday through Friday, 7:30 am to 3 pm. Please call 651-730-2740 for rates.

CODE RED. Washington County's "Code Red" emergency notification system allows for automated messages to be sent to the entire county, select cities, or to designated areas or neighborhoods within minutes. To register, select the Code Red link at www.ci.oakdale.mn.us.

DIAL-A-RIDE TRANSPORTATION. Transit Link offers transportation and is intended to serve areas where regular transit route service is not available. Transit Link is available from 6 am to 7 pm, Monday to Friday. To reserve a ride, please call 651-602-5465 up to five business days in advance.

FREE CABLE (Oakdale residents can get channels 6, 14, 15, 16 (local government access), 20, 95, and 98 at no cost). Call 651-747-3801 and ask for the free "Universal Coverage Channels".

GARAGE SALES. Each property may have a total of three garage sales per year; with each sale running no more than four days. This includes participation in the citywide sales.

HEATING BILL HELP. Need assistance with your heating bills? Check out the programs offered at www.capr.w.org/community-action-services/energy-assistance.

HOUSE NUMBERS. Time is of the essence when emergency personnel are searching for your home or business. That is why exterior address numbers need to be visible from the street, a minimum of 4" in height, and located near the primary entrance.

HYDRANT FLUSHING. Each spring, Public Works crews flush out the fire hydrants in the city to remove sediment. During this process, there could be a slight drop in pressure and water from your faucet may be discolored for a brief period.

IRRIGATION SYSTEM TIPS FOR HOMES AND BUSINESSES. Irrigate only when necessary; one inch of water per week, including rainfall, is all that's needed to maintain a healthy lawn. Turn off your system's automatic setting and irrigate only when the grass needs water. Contact your irrigation contractor to discuss water saving options and newer technologies. Finally, inspect your system for defective or missing sprinkler heads to ensure that water is reaching all designated zones.

LOAD LIMITS. During the spring thaw, streets are weakened by water trapped below the pavement. Weight restrictions are implemented to help minimize wear and to allow the base time to stabilize. During this time, please advise contractors and delivery providers to comply with posted load limits for city streets.

MAILBOXES. Mailboxes need to be installed as follows: minimum height of the mailbox (not the post) needs to be at least 45" from the gutter channel. The face of the mailbox should not extend beyond the back edge of the curb.

MAIL DELIVERY. Take care not to park within 10 feet of *either* side of any mailbox between the hours of 8 am and 6 pm, Monday through Saturday.

PROPERTY COMPLAINTS. Have a concern with or complaint about a neighboring property? Call 651-702-5225. Please note that you need to live within 200' of the subject property -- or be able to see it from your property. All complaints are anonymous.

PROPERTY VALUATION MEETING. If you have a concern with the value of your property, the process for having it reviewed is to attend the Washington County Property Valuation Meeting on April 12 at City Hall, 1584 Hadley Avenue, from 5 to 7 pm. Questions? Please call the assessor at 651-702-5231.

RECREATIONAL VEHICLES. Throughout the year, each property is allowed to keep one recreational vehicle outside: in the side or rear yard (at least 5' from property line) or on the driveway (snowmobiles from November 1 to April 30; other vehicles from May 1 to November 1). Having more recreational vehicles is fine provided only one is outside. Questions? Please call 651-702-5225.

SUMP PUMPS - PLEASE ROUTE OUT! The flow that enters the sanitary sewer system through toilets, wash tubs, and floor drains is sent to the treatment plant in Saint Paul. The flow is metered and Oakdale is charged accordingly. The city, and in turn, our utility customers, pay for additional flow. If you use a sump pump, please note that it is illegal to discharge sump pumps into the sewer system. Route discharge outside to your yard, the street, the storm sewer, or waterway. If your sump pump needs to discharge into the sewer system, even temporarily, please call 651-730-2710 to make arrangements.

VETERAN'S MEMORIAL. The Oakdale Veteran's Memorial is located at 1584 Hadley and honors each branch of the military. Order an engraved paver for any person who has served or is currently serving in the military. Oakdale residency is not required. Cost per paver: \$100.

WINTER PARKING. Winter parking guidelines remain in place until April 1 -- no matter how much, or how little, snow falls. During this time, vehicles cannot park on city streets from 12 to 5 am each day. Also, any time there is an accumulated snowfall of 2" or more, parked vehicles need to remain off city streets until the full width of the roadway has been plowed.

UTILITY BILL PAYMENT OPTIONS

Auto Bank Payments. Have utility bills automatically deducted from your bank account on the bill's due date each billing cycle by completing the "Automatic Utility Payment Application" provided on the Utility Billing page at www.ci.oakdale.mn.us. Please mail completed form to the Finance Department, 1584 Hadley Avenue, Oakdale, MN 55128.

Drop Box. Payments made by check or credit card can be placed in the drive-up drop box located in the City Hall parking lot. Please place your payment, along with the stub from your utility bill, in a sealed envelope before depositing into the drop box.

Mail. Mail your check and the stub from your utility bill. Or, fill out the section for a credit card payment on your utility bill stub and mail to the Finance Department, 1584 Hadley Avenue, Oakdale, MN 55128.

Pay In Person. Bring cash, a check or credit card to the first floor counter at City Hall, 1584 Hadley Avenue, Monday-Friday, 8 am to 4:30 pm.

Pay by Phone with Credit Card. Call 651-730-2716 or 1-877-885-7968 to provide your credit card information during regular business hours (Monday through Friday, 8 am to 4:30 pm). No fee is applied for credit card payments.

On-line Payments Go to www.ci.oakdale.mn.us, click on "Utility Bills & Other Payments" button. Select "Pay Utility Bill", which will take you to the PSN site to register or sign-in and make a payment. You can also select the "View Utility Bill" button and register or sign-in to view bills. Registered utility customers will receive an email each time a bill is ready. Then you can choose to pay online, mail in a payment, call in a credit card number, or stop at City Hall.

Pay on Mobile Device. Download "PSN Payments" from App Store or Google Play. (Register online before using app).

Senior or Disabled Person Discounts are available for qualified individuals with a total annual household income of \$48,500 or less. There are no base charges, the sewer charge is for actual usage during the winter quarter. Seniors must be 62 or older and the primary resident at the service address. OAKDALE'S ANIMALS

CHICKENS. Interested in owning chickens? Please talk to the Police Department about obtaining a Special Use Permit.

DEER. Deer are beautiful, wild animals, but deer and developed areas can spell t-r-o-u-b-l-e. Deer can wreak havoc on gardens, landscaping plants, and trees and shrubs. As such, feeding deer is not permitted and creates community-wide problems necessitating in the reduction of the population.

FEEDING WILDLIFE AND WATER FOWL. Please remember that the feeding of wildlife and water fowl is not allowed. Bird feeders are allowed but they need to be least five feet above the ground or structure.

GEESE. Every year, the city receives numerous complaints about Canadian Geese and their droppings. As such, feeding geese is not permitted. View the city's new "Goose Management Plan" at www.ci.oakdale.mn.us or call 651-730-2704 to request a copy.

LEASHES. When dogs and cats leave their premises, they need to be leashed or under other physical control. Also, dogs need to be leashed when in city parks, especially in the Oakdale Nature Preserve, and on other public land.

LICENSES. Several times a year, lost pets are picked up by the police department. Lucky pets are wearing their city-issued license and their owners are easily contacted. The unlucky ones go to the local shelter where they wait for their family to claim them. Even house pets can wander away and wearing a license may be their only form of communication. In Oakdale, each dog or cat over six months of age needs to possess a current city-issued license. Licenses are available at 1584 Hadley Avenue, during regular business hours (present a certificate of current rabies vaccination) or at the annual vaccination clinic. City-issued licenses expire March 31.

NUISANCES. Animals which "run at large" may be impounded by the Police Department whether they are licensed or not. It's important to remember that not everyone enjoys the company of pets - even some other pets. Please take care so that your pet(s) does not disturb others or their property.

NUMBER OF PETS. Pet owners with more than three of any single type of domestic animal, over three months old, need to obtain a Special Use Permit from the Oakdale Police Department.

RABIES VACCINATION CLINIC. Each year, the city tries to offer a cost-effective way for owners to vaccinate their pets. Plans are being formulated for this year's clinic. Details forthcoming on the city's web page and Facebook.

SANITATION. Pet owners need to remove and properly dispose of pet droppings from their yard on a regular basis. Also, taking your pet off your property, be sure to have something with you to pick up excrement and disposing of it in a trash receptacle. You will find Mutt Mitt dispensers in parks for your convenience.

WILD OR EXOTIC ANIMALS. Interested in owning wild or exotic animals? Please talk to the Oakdale Police Department to learn which animals are allowed by first obtaining a Special Use Permit.

GATEWAY CORRIDOR (BRT) NEWS

The Gold Line will progress in the planning phase following recent approvals from Oakdale and Woodbury of the proposed bus rapid transit (BRT) route. The cities passed resolutions supporting an alternate route developed after Lake Elmo opted out of the project.

The project, identified as the Gold Line, will now move to the engineering phase, which will include detailed analysis on the route, environmental impacts, and the next round of public meetings. In about two years' time, cities the Gold Line passes through will again vote on whether they support the project.

The Gold Line, an all day transit service, will run in both directions from Union Depot in Saint Paul, through the city's east side, Maplewood, Landfall, and Oakdale, and terminate at Woodbury Village. It will stop at multiple locations and include connections to the regional transit system. It is anticipated that the Gold Line could be operational by 2023.

OAKDALE FARES WELL IN COMMUNITY SURVEY

Four hundred Oakdale residents gave of their time last fall to provide input about how the city is performing overall, what is being done right, and where there are possible areas for improvement. The result? The majority of residents are satisfied with the job the city is doing!

The city got high marks in public safety (police, fire, rescue, ambulance), neighborhood appearance and upkeep, snow plowing, recreation programs and recreational amenities, parks upkeep and maintenance, and customer service. (This means 80 to 97 percent of the residents surveyed were satisfied, depending on the area under discussion.)

The survey identified a few areas of improvement: property taxes, crime, growth, and the local job market. Jason Foutz, assistant city administrator, said city staff are processing the survey results. "Our priority will be to continually address areas where improvement is needed. For instance, currently, we are always looking at ways to keep taxes low, and the Police Department keeps on top of any crime issues." He noted that 95 percent of survey respondents said the police department was doing a good job.

Foutz also said that although there isn't much space left in Oakdale to be developed, the community can be assured any new development will be managed well.

Finally, about 70 percent of the participants said they believed their opinion mattered.

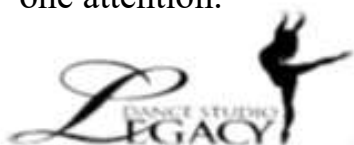

A “small, but mighty” group of volunteers gave their time last September 10 to plant 150 native plants in the swale area at Tanners Lake. The dry creek is now lined on both sides through the entire feature, making it both visually attractive and functional as water is now infiltrated as it moves through the swale.

KEEP SPRING RUN-OFF CLEAN

To help keep our ponds and wetlands clean this spring and summer, please follow these simple steps:

- Direct water from downspouts onto the lawn, away from your house and paved surfaces.
- Remove debris (leaves, branches, trash) from the storm drains near your home, particularly after a rainstorm.
- Don’t rake debris (leaves, grass, sand and dirt) from your lawn into the street.
- Don’t apply lawn care products to frozen ground; wait until the grass starts growing.
- Sweep up and reuse any lawn care products that fall on streets, sidewalks and driveways.
- Clean your lawn and garden equipment on the grass, rather than on hard surfaces, in the gutter, or over storm drains.
- Sweep up soil and grass clippings. Never wash or blow them into the street.
- Seal your trash bags and keep litter out of the street because storm drains carry trash from your street to lakes and rivers, even if they are miles away.
- Pick up after your pet so that the waste, which is full of harmful nutrients and bacteria, does not get washed into lakes and rivers.
- Keep your car regularly maintained so fluids don’t leak on the street.

ZERO WASTE

Waste Prevention vs. Waste Management

Zero Waste is a philosophy that encourages us to change our lifestyles and practices so that no trash is sent to landfills or incinerators. All materials are designed to become resources for us or others to use. Certainly, Zero Waste means manufacturers must design and manage products and processes to avoid and eliminate the volume and toxicity of waste and materials, conserve and recover all resources, and not burn or bury them. But there are many things we as consumers can do to contribute.

Here are some tips to carry out the Zero Waste philosophy:

- Arm yourself with a reusable water bottle, a couple grocery totes, a few cloth bags, and reusable jars and bottles.
- Swap paper towels for reusable rags.
- Bring your own jar to the ice cream shop to buy bulk ice cream, a pillow case to the bakery for your bread, or your bottles to the winery/brewery.
- Use baking soda as a scrubber along with a compostable cleaning brush (a wooden one with natural hair).
- Reinvent your leftovers before they go bad.
- Reuse single-side printed paper for grocery shopping and errands list.
- Use your lettuce cleaning water to water plants.
- Open your oven door after baking/cooking in the winter to cool your oven and to warm your house.
- Buy second-hand clothing.
- If you must buy new, look for quality and leave the shoe box at the store.
- Buy dishwasher detergent in bulk; use white vinegar as a rinsing aid.
- Reuse junk mail response envelopes; when buying new paper, choose recycled.
- Use your library for business magazines and books; sell your books or donate them to your library or place them in a "Little Library".
- Use memory sticks and external drives instead of CDs.
- Medicine choices: choose tablets (pain reliever, for example) in a plastic jar (usually a recyclable #2), instead of the tablets individually wrapped in aluminum/plastic.
- Use drought tolerant and native plants; replace your lawn with short native grasses.
- Make room for compost.
- Return plastic containers to the garden shop.

THE FIVE Rs of Zero Waste:

REFUSE what you do not need,
REDUCE what you do need,
REUSE what you consume,
RECYCLE what you cannot Refuse,
Reduce or Reuse, and
ROT (compost) the rest.

DISPOSING OF BULKY ITEMS

For many, recycling the small stuff is easy. But what do you do with the big stuff like appliances, furniture, and carpet? Your trash hauler may pick up furniture and other large household items, so call them first to see what they collect and if there are additional fees.
