Meet Code Ken!

The City's Building Inspection Department's Code Enforcement Division works to keep Oakdale a clean, safe, and inviting community.



Code Ken, the city's code enforcement officer, seeks out violations as well as responds to complaints made to the city. Some of the more common complaints include junk and inoperable vehicles, debris in yards, trash container placement, tall grass, and storage of recreational vehicles.

Whenever you see a potential violation near your home, please take a moment to report it to the city.

After making an inspection, the city will send a notice to the property owner and work with them on resolving the violation.

Keep Oakdale Lookin' Good!

Maintaining your home and yard not only helps beautify and preserve your investment but keeps the entire neighborhood looking good! Here are a few simple things you can do now:

DISPOSE OF BRANCHES AND BRUSH. For a nominal fee, you may take branches and brush, under eight inches in diameter, to Public Works, 1900 Hadley, Monday through Friday, 7:30 AM to 3 PM. Please call 651-730-2740 for rates.

RECREATION EQUIPMENT. Hockey nets, basketball hoops, and other such equipment cannot be placed in boulevards or streets.

RECREATIONAL VEHICLES. Each property is allowed to keep one recreational vehicle outside in either the side or rear yard (at least five feet from property line) or on the driveway. Snowmobiles may be stored outside from November 1 to April 30; other vehicles from May 1 to November 1. Having more recreational vehicles at your property is ok provided only one is outside.

WASTE / RECYCLING CONTAINERS. Containers should be placed at the curb just prior to 7 AM on collection day and removed no later than 8 PM on collection day. Containers must be stored inside or on the side or rear of your home or garage; screening containers from view is acceptable provided you first obtain city approval. Please call 651-739-5150 for details.

YARDS. The height of grass in your lawn should not exceed six inches; noxious weeds need to be controlled.



MANY UTILITY BILL PAYMENT OPTIONS AVAILABLE TO YOU

Oakdale provides your water and sewer (wastewater) services. Most years, rates get a slight inflationary adjustment (see 2019 Utility Rates chart provided). In the 2018 Annual Utility Rate Survey, reported by AES and Nexus, Oakdale's utility rates ranked tenth lowest of the 30 metro area communities surveyed. To learn more, please call 651-730-2714.

AUTO PAY

Utility payments made by check or credit card can be placed in the secure drive-up drop box located in the City Hall parking lot at 1584 Hadley Avenue. Please place your payment, along with the payment stub from your utility bill, in a sealed envelope and deposit in the drop box any time day or night.

OAKDALE'S DRINKING WATER: the Facts, the Fix, the Future

Interested in learning more about Oakdale's drinking water, the city's water treatment facility, or the recent settlement with 3M? Here's an overview as well as some resources to learn even more.

A Bit of History

PFCs were made and used by several companies around the world in household and industrial products such as stain repellents, lubricants, fire retardant and suppressants, and more. The 3M Company made PFCs at its Cottage Grove facility from the late 1940s until 2002.

PFC wastes were disposed of in several landfills in Washington County including Lake Elmo, Oakdale and in southern Woodbury. The source of the PFCs in our groundwater has been identified as these landfills.

In 2004, the Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) began testing municipal drinking water in Oakdale and several area communities. In Oakdale, the tests detected the presence of PFCs at borderline health safety levels.

Water Treatment Facility

In response to the detection of PFCs the City of Oakdale constructed a water treatment facility, which went into operation in 2006. The facility was designed to remove PFOA and PFOS (two types of PFCs detected in Oakdale) from the water system and improve the taste and odor of the water.

Water Treatment Facility Facts

- Fully operational in 2006
- Construction cost over \$3 million, paid for by 3M
- Owned, maintained, and operated by the City of Oakdale, with incurred maintenance costs reimbursed by 3M
- First full-scale treatment facility for removal of PFCs in the country
- Treats 2,500 gallons per minute from two municipal wells

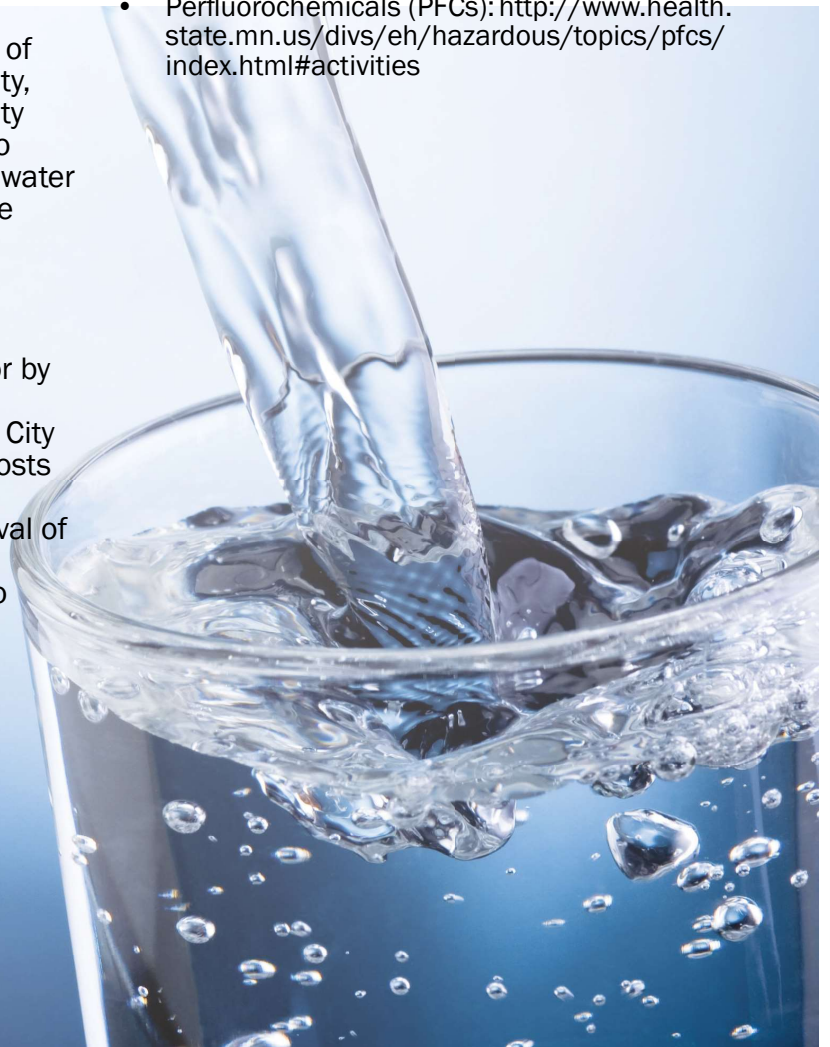
3M Settlement

In 2010, Minnesota's attorney general sued 3M Company alleging that the company's production of chemicals known as PFCs had damaged drinking water and natural resources in the east metro, including Oakdale. On February 20, 2018, the State of Minnesota and 3M reached a settlement agreement, with the state receiving a grant from 3M for \$850 million.

The state has formed working groups with representatives from east metro communities impacted by PFCs tasked with creating a framework for decision making on how the settlement monies will be spent. The City of Oakdale is represented on both the 3M and Government Work Group as well as the Citizen and Business Work Group. Oakdale's citizen representatives are Bruce Johnson and Monica Stiglich. Oakdale's governmental representative is City Administrator Bart Fischer.

ANIMALS IN OAKDALE

CHICKENS. Interested in owning chickens? Please call 651-702-5204 to learn more.

DEER. Deer in suburban areas have been known to can wreak havoc on gardens, trees, shrubs, and other landscaping. As such, feeding deer or putting out salt licks is not allowed anywhere in the city; doing so can actually result in the need to reduce the deer population.

DOG PARK. Oakdale's off-leash dog park, the Oakdale Bark Park, is located along 50th Street, between Helena and Heather Ridge roads. There is no cost to utilize the park; dogs must be licensed.

GEESE. If you have been experiencing issues with geese, please review the city's "Goose Management Plan" at www.ci.oakdale.mn.us and remember to not feed geese or any water fowl.

LEASHES. When dogs and cats leave their property, please make sure they are leashed or physically controlled in some manner. Leashes are required in all city parks, except for the Oakdale Bark Park.

LICENSES. Each dog or cat over six months of age needs to possess a current city-issued license. Licenses are available at 1584 Hadley Avenue, during regular business hours by presenting a certificate of current rabies vaccination (see Oakdale Pet Event ad below).

NUISANCES. Animals who "run at large" are at risk of being picked up animal control, whether they are licensed or not. Plus, it's important to remember that not everyone enjoys the company of pets - even some other pets so please take care so that your pet does not disturb others or their property.

NUMBER OF PETS. Pet owners with more than three of any single type of domestic animal, over three months old, need to obtain a permit from the Police Department.

SANITATION. Remember to regularly remove and properly dispose of pet droppings from your yard. Also, taking your pet off your property, pick up any excrement. Oakdale parks offer Mutt Mitt dispensers for your convenience.

COUNCIL ADOPTS BUDGET, LEVY

At their December 11 meeting, the City Council adopted the budget and levy for 2019. Did you know that out of every property tax dollar you pay, around 35 cents comes to Oakdale? This covers, among other things, 24/7 police, fire, and emergency services; park maintenance; community events; and street maintenance, including snow removal. The remaining 65 cents goes to Washington County, school districts, and special taxing districts. The city's budget process begins each April so if you would like to participate in the development of next year's budget, or if you have questions or would like additional information about the city's budget, please call Finance Director Suzy Warren at 651-730-2714.

Did you know that estimated property market value and/or market value credits can vary greatly throughout a community? As such, some property owners will see their property taxes go up, some remaining the same, and some going down. HIGHWAY 36 AND HADLEY AVENUE PROJECT STARTING SOON

Improvements are in store for the Hadley Avenue and Highway 36 intersection, with construction set to begin this spring.

Planned improvements will enhance user safety and mobility throughout this area, improve travel times, and more efficiently and safely manage increasing traffic and pedestrian/bicycle movements.

The project will include:

- Removing the existing intersection.
- Building a bridge over Highway 36, at Hadley Avenue.
- Creating ramps to access Highway 36 and three roundabouts to provide access to Mills Fleet Farm and Marcus Theatre.

An addition, the existing Gateway Trail crossing at Hadley Avenue will be converted to a grade separation that will provide unencumbered travel for pedestrians and bicyclists. The trail connection will be placed under Hadley Avenue, removing the need for pedestrian crossing Hadley Avenue in that location.

Costs for the project will be shared by the City of Oakdale, Washington County, the Minnesota Department of Transportation, and federal funding.

PLANNING CONTINUES ON METRO GOLD LINE

The METRO Gold Line is coming to Oakdale. As part of the regional METRO system, the Gold Line will connect people across the region to job centers, housing options, transit stations and key destinations in the Interstate 94 corridor. The planned nine-mile Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) line will connect Saint Paul, Maplewood, Landfall, Oakdale and Woodbury generally along Interstate 94.

Gold Line service will offer new opportunities for Oakdale residents to conveniently connect to neighboring suburbs and to downtown Saint Paul and beyond. The Gold Line, which will operate in exclusive lanes dedicated only to transit buses, will provide frequent, all-day service in both directions, seven days a week.

The Gold Line project is currently undertaking guideway and station area design work. There will be two stations servicing Oakdale, at Greenway Avenue and Hudson Boulevard, and Helmo Avenue just south of 3rd Street. The Helmo station area plan that was approved by Oakdale City Council in June will have a connection to Bielenberg via a new bridge over I-94. The proposed bridge will include lanes for autos, pedestrians and bikes, and the BRT. The Greenway station area plan is expected to be completed this March. Service is expected to begin in 2024.

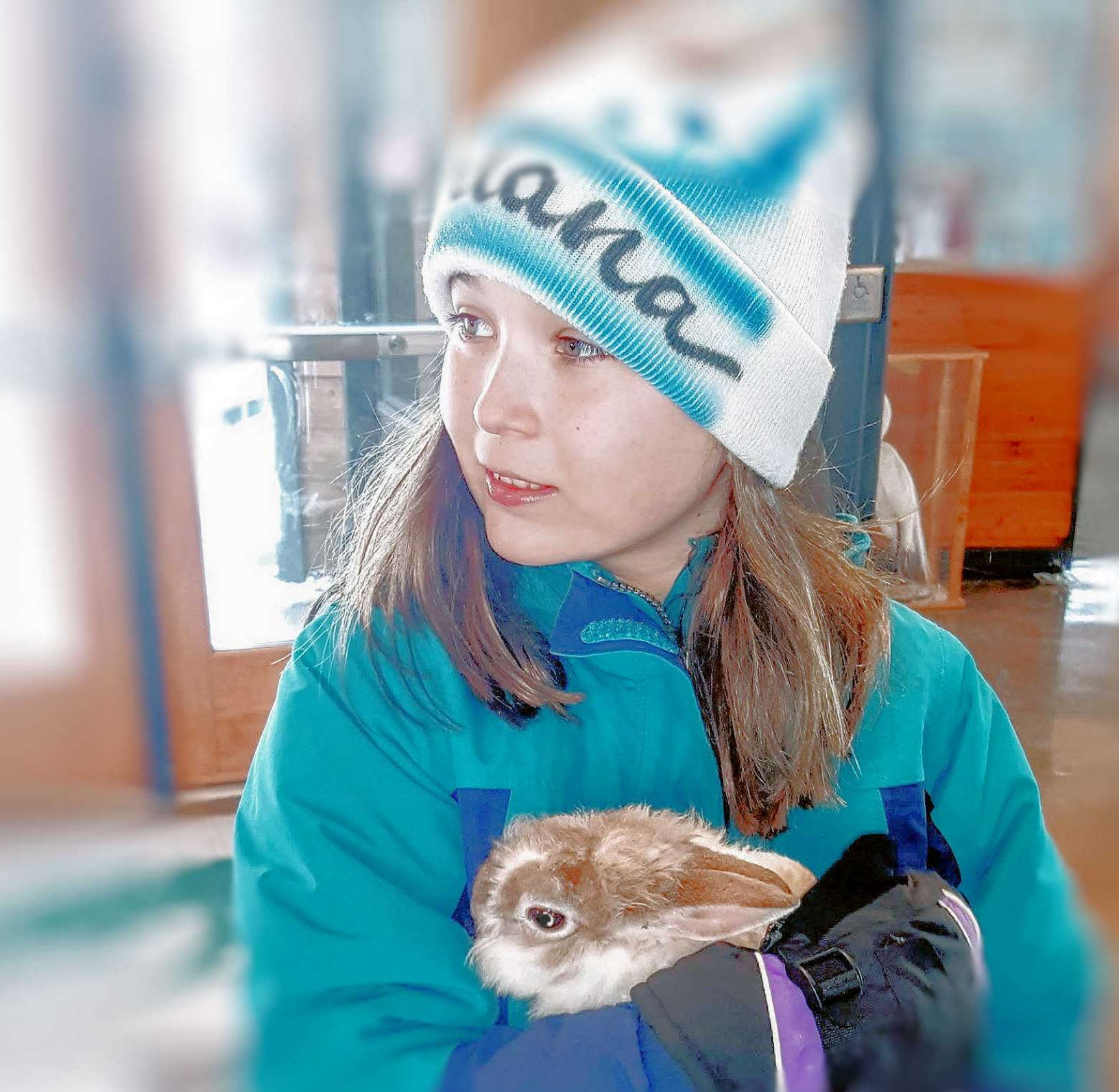

ROAD TRIP: Historic Forestville and Mystery Cave Wednesday, May 22

Venture to southern Minnesota for a day packed with history and geology. First stop is Historic Forestville, a restored 1800 village. During the 1850s-1860s, Forestville had 20 buildings and was a thriving community. Your guided walking tour begins at the visitor center and travels through the garden, kitchen, Meighen family house, offices, and the general store filled with original 19th century merchandise. 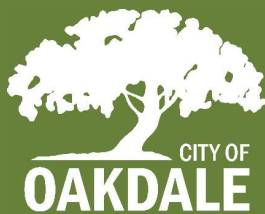
