- **Fire Ring:** noncombustible material and located at least 25 feet from any structure.
- **Fire Materials:** clean, dry wood so that smoke does not create any issues for your neighbors and they call 911.
- **Have a hose close by to extinguish the fire before you head inside.**

DO YOUR PART, ONE DROP AT A TIME

You know that the job of the storm drain in the street is to carry water (rain, melted snow) off the street to lakes, rivers, and wetlands. But do you also know that we can all help protect our nature resources by doing these few simple things?

- Removing leaves, seeds, and grass clippings from streets, gutters, and storm drains.
- Keeping trash from entering a storm drain.
- Picking up pet waste.
- Choosing a zero-phosphorous fertilizer; and sweeping up any spilled fertilizer off paved surfaces.
- Mulching or bagging grass clippings. Compost clippings or take them to Composting Concepts, 4600 Cottage Grove Dr. in Woodbury. Call 651-769-0531.
- In the winter, use salt sparingly on icy walkways. When temperatures fall below 15 degrees, use sand.

Sweep up! Rake up! Pick up!

Rain and melting snow can wash anything that's on our streets and other paved surfaces down storm drains and into lakes, rivers, and wetlands.



Leaves, grass, and dirt contain phosphorus, which feeds the algae that turn lakes green. Please Keep them off streets and sidewalks.



Trash clogs drains and pipes causing flooding. Please put trash into garbage containers.



Salt is almost impossible to remove from waterways. Just one teaspoon pollutes five gallons of water forever. Use it sparingly.



Pet waste carries harmful bacteria, parasites, and phosphorus. Please pick up after your pet.

DISCOVERY BACKPACKS

Stop at the Discovery Center and check out one of our "Discovery Backpacks." Inside the packs you will find everything needed for a summertime exploration into the adjacent nature preserve. Seek out animal tracks, identify different types of trees and flowers, go on a scavenger hunt, use binoculars to bird watch or catch a glimpse of the deer, fox and owls that call the nature preserve home. Catch interesting critters using the insect net.

EDER ONE-ROOM SCHOOLHOUSE

The Eder School was built in 1888 as District #12 of Washington County. It closed in 1920 and became a storage shed for the Eder family until it was moved to the Oakdale Nature Preserve and restored by the Oakdale-Lake Elmo Historical Society in 2004. NORDIC WALKING POLES

Using Nordic Walking Poles, turn your ordinary walk into a total body exercise that delivers far more motivating results and makes walking more fun! Poles resembling ski poles are used to involve the upper extremities when you walk, toning and firming every major muscle at the same time. The poles are designed using rubber tips, making it possible to use them on pavement while reducing the impact of the hard surface. Who Was That Masked Bird?

Ever wonder about a bird you saw? Did you know the hobby of birding has become more popular than golf? And what's great is you can do it almost anywhere and anytime. With 174 species of birds found in the Oakdale Nature Preserve, it will be fun to learn the skills to help you find and identify a few you won't see at a bird feeder.

Presenter Jill Sadler has birded on all seven continents and is a former Minnesota Zoo World of Birds Trainer. Class will start outdoors with a walk in the preserve, then inside for a review session. Class fee includes a book for beginning birders, checklist of Minnesota birds, and reference materials. Please bring binoculars if you have them and dress for the weather.



OAKDALE BARK PARK

Off-Leash Dog Park

The Bark Park is open year round and is located off 50th Street, between Helena Road and Heather Ridge Road. The park is fenced with a transition corridor. A pet waste dispenser is available. The park also offers parking and sitting areas for pet parents. Coming this year: paved parking and water spigot.

Important things for you and your pet to know about the Bark Park:

- No fee or permit needed to utilize the park!
- Park hours: Dusk to Dawn
- Dogs must be leashed prior to entering and upon leaving the off-leash area and in transition corridors.
- Dogs must be properly licensed and vaccinated, and not designated as a dangerous dog or in heat.
- Dogs must stay within fenced area.
- Pet parents are liable for damage or injury inflicted by their dogs.
- Pet parents must be in verbal control of their dogs at all times and prevent aggressive behavior, biting, fighting, or excessive barking.
- Pet parents must be at least 16 years of age and not handling more than two dogs.
- Pet parents must clean up and dispose of pet waste.
- Pet parents must have a visible leash with them.

MUTT MITTS

Please keep the city's parks free of dog droppings by using the Mutt Mitt's dispensers in parks. Also keep the city's trails and sidewalks free of droppings; pick up after your pup whenever you're out walking.

DOGS TO BE LEASHED

With the exception of the Oakdale Bark Park, it is against the law for dogs to be unleashed in city parks. Dogs must be on a leash or other physical restraint held by a person with the ability to properly control the animal.


