METRO GOLD LINE BRT SERVICE BEGINS

The new rapid bus line serving Oakdale and the east metro area opened March 22.

City staff and officials attended opening-weekend festivities for the METRO Gold Line Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) which officially began service on March 22. The 10-mile rapid bus line connects St. Paul, Maplewood, Landfall, Oakdale, and Woodbury along Interstate 94. It is the first BRT in Minnesota to operate primarily in bus-only lanes. The Gold Line provides frequent, all-day service in both directions through 16 stations with enhanced features, four park and rides, and connections to new and upgraded trails and sidewalks.

Two stations serve Oakdale:

- Greenway Station - Located at Greenway Avenue N and Hudson Boulevard N
- Helmo Station - Located at Helmo Avenue N and Henslow Avenue N

There is a surface Park and Ride lot at the Helmo Station located on the west side of Helmo Avenue N, just south of the station platform. The parking lot can be accessed by turning west onto 2nd Street and then following the road south to the lot.

Gold Line operates between 5 AM and 12 AM (midnight), seven days a week with service every 10 minutes on weekdays during peak and

midday times, and every 15 minutes on weekends during peak and midday times. For route and schedule information, visit www.metrotransit.org/goldline.

NIGHT TO UNITE AND COMMUNITY COOKOUT

Night to Unite is an annual tradition that helps neighbors get to know each other and fosters partnerships between citizens and public safety organizations in an effort to make our neighborhoods safer. This year, Night to Unite will be hosted on Tuesday, August 5. Neighborhoods hosting a gathering should register their block parties at www.oakdalemn.gov/271.

For residents and neighborhoods not organizing a party this year, come to Walton Park (1584 Hadley Avenue N) for a Night to Unite gathering from 5 to 7 PM, hosted by the Oakdale Fire and Police Departments. Join City officials along with local businesses to play games and enjoy a free hot dog cookout provided by the Oakdale Area Chamber of Commerce (OACC).

CITY-WIDE CLEAN UP EVENT

The City of Oakdale successfully hosted a City-Wide Clean Up event in the fall of 2024. Over 300 cars came through the Public Works facility to dispose of hard-to-recycle items. The amount of items collected included:

- 69 mattresses with 96 percent being recycled;
- 5,380 pounds of electronics;
- 104 appliances;
- 16.87 tons of general trash; and
- 3.69 tons of scrap metal.

WATER TOWER RECONDITIONING PROJECT

As part of Oakdale's effort to maintain reliable and sustainable infrastructure, routine maintenance must be completed on the City's water towers. In December, the City Council approved reconditioning of Water Tower 3, located at 2347 Hallmark Avenue N, for this spring and summer.

Work on the tower is currently underway. Licensed contractors performed upgrades to the interior and are currently repainting the exterior to give it a revitalized appearance. There may be times the tower is completely obstructed from view, and there will be construction equipment and increased noise in the area. The project is expected to conclude in July. COMMUNITY SURVEY RESULTS

The City of Oakdale contracted with Polco to conduct the National Community Survey (NCS) in 2024 which uses standard questions across communities nationwide to compile benchmark data. Oakdale's results were compared to those benchmarks and results from the City's 2020 survey. Notable highlights from the survey include overall confidence in Oakdale's government, its openness, and its transparency. ANNUAL DRINKING WATER REPORT

Each year the City makes available its annual report on drinking water which includes information about source water, levels of contaminants and compliance with drinking water rules. The 2023 report is currently online, and the 2024 report will be available later this summer. To learn more and to view the annual report, visit www.oakdalemn.gov/340/Drinking-Water.

ILLICIT DISCHARGE

Only rain, melted snow and sump pump discharge should enter storm drains. Yard waste, automotive fluids, pet waste or other illicit discharge that enters a storm sewer can flow into lakes, rivers and ponds causing pollution. Report illegal dumping or illicit discharge if you see it. Do not dispose of grass clippings, animal excrement or other discharge into ponding areas, which can also affect water quality of wetlands and lakes.

EMERALD ASH BORER

Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) is an invasive pest that kills ash trees and is now pervasive in Oakdale. Ash trees infected with EAB become weak and pose a danger to people and property. It can take several years for ash trees to show signs and/or symptoms of EAB infestation. A tree can appear healthy but may still be infested. It is important to identify ash trees, take steps to prevent the spread of EAB, and remove infested trees.

YARD MAINTENANCE QUESTIONS ANSWERED

During the summer, the City receives many questions related to yard maintenance. Here are some answers to the most frequently asked questions.

What are the rules about grass height?

Grass must be kept at a maximum of six inches, cut at least every two weeks, and weeds kept under control. When the City receives a complaint, the property owner has five days to cut the grass, or the City will cut the grass and charge the property owner.

How can I report a non-compliant property?

The fastest way to submit a property complaint is through the SeeClickFix app. Residents can also call **651-702-5225** to file a complaint. In order to file a complaint, you must live within 200 feet of the subject property or be able to see it from your property. All reports are anonymous.

When can I water my grass?

Odd-numbered addresses are allowed to water on odd-numbered days. Even-numbered addresses are allowed to water on even-numbered days. Refrain from watering during 10 AM and 5 PM when water loss is greatest.

What can I do about buckthorn on my property?

Residents are encouraged to remove invasive buckthorn from their property. A weed wrench is available through the City to assist residents with removal. Buckthorn can also be dropped off for free at Public Works. Please call **651-730-2740** for wrench availability and details.

Does Public Works accept yard waste?

Public Works (1900 Hadley Avenue N) does not accept grass clippings or leaves, but residents can drop off branches and brush under eight inches in diameter for a nominal fee. Drop off hours are Monday to Friday, 7:30 AM to 3 PM, through the third Friday in October.

Where can I take my yard waste for free?

Free yard waste disposal is available at the North Yard Waste Site at the new Washington County North Environmental Center (6065 Headwaters Parkway, Forest Lake). Find more information and hours at www.washingtoncountymn.gov/628/Yard-Waste.

There are also four disposal locations in Ramsey County that Washington County residents may use for free with a photo ID. Scan the code for locations.
